Call to Order:

Mr. Wampler called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m.

Announcement:

Mr. Stowers announced and welcomed Wendy McAdams Dorr as the new Foundation Accountant and Operations Manager.

Approval of Minutes:

The minutes from the February 1, 2022 Board Meeting were approved. **Motion to approve as presented, Mr. Peacock; Second, Mr. Bagby. Motion carried unanimously.**

Finance and Investment Reports:

Mr. Wood presented the Statement of Financial Position, Statement of Activities, and Investment Reports as of February 28, 2022. Total assets are \$67,066,883 and total liabilities are \$155,000, bringing

the Total Fund Balance to \$66,911,833. Note: Cash and Cash Equivalents are overstated by \$3,727,129 due to an internal system error that is currently being worked on. The net fund balance with the correction is \$63,184,754For the previous fiscal year as of February 28, 2021 the Total Fund Balance was \$60,939,884. Total Revenues were \$6,565,023 and Total Expenses were \$1,471,372. A Statement of Activities from the previous fiscal year from July 1, 2021 through February 28, 2021 shoes Total Revenues of \$10,863,058 and Total Expenses of \$2,492,331 for a Net Increase in Fund balance of \$8,370,727. The Net decrease to the Merrill Lynch EMA account since July 1, 2021 was (\$809,999), bringing the Total Market Value to \$62,213,119 as of February 28, 2022. The Net Increase to the Vanguard Wellington Account (Science Development Fund) since July 1, 2021 was \$4,934, bringing the Total Market Value to \$328,451 as the last statement date of December 31, 2021. Combined total holdings of the Merrill Lynch EMA and Vanguard Wellington accounts were \$62, 541,571. The portfolio allocation was 4.38% Cash and Cash Equivalents, 62.04% Equity, 8.82% Alternative Investments and 24.77 Fixed Income. Motion to accept the February 28, 2022 financial reports as presented, Mr. Bagby; Second, Ms. Kirby. Motion carried unanimously.

Underwriting of Mattie Kelly Arts Center Series 2022-2023:

Mr. Wood presented the 2022-2023 Mattie Kelly Arts Center Series. He noted that each year the Foundation is asked to underwrite the season. Motion to approve the underwriting of the 2022-23 Mattie Kelly Arts Center season at a cost not to exceed \$510,000, Maj Gen Litke; Second, Rev. Williams. Motion carried unanimously.

FY23 Operating Budget Update:

Mr. Wood presented the operating budget for FY23. The operating fund currently has a balance of \$1,884,445 as of March 31, 2022. Mr. Stowers advised of three items for FY23; 1) The Foundation will increase Internal Support Services for salaries from 50% to 75%, which equates to \$288,000. 2) The Foundation will continue to support legislative services for the College at \$70,000. 3) For faculty/staff to improve academic services for student success, the Foundation will increase support to the College by \$25,000. Mr. Stowers advised Foundation staff work hard to ensure expenses do not surpass revenue. Motion to approve the FY23 Foundation Operating Budget as presented, Mr. Bagby; Second, Mr. Jefferson. Motion carried unanimously.

Proposal for Use of Innovation Fund – Raider Champions Scholarship Endowment:

Mr. Wood presented the Proposal for the Use of Innovation Fund – Raider Champions Scholarship Endowment. The vision of the College is to create the Raider Champions Scholarship Endowment that will allow every qualified recent high school from Okaloosa or Walton County who enrolls at NWFSC can attend cost free (tuition, fees, and book/materials). At least 85% of students who earn a degree/credential at NWFSC remain in the local community, so the fund supports the continued strengthening of the region's workforce. The Foundation has been renting its broadband spectrum to mobile telecommunication firms since 2006 and placing the revenue in an Innovation Fund, which currently has a balance of more than \$730,000. The Foundation is proposing \$500,000 be transferred to the Raider Champions Scholarship Fund. Motion to approve the transfer of \$500,000 from the Innovation Fund to an endowment supporting the Raider Champions Scholarship Fund as presented, Mr. Wolfrom; Second, Mr. Ross. Motion carried unanimously.

Alumni Awards:

Dr. Arnold presented the Alumni Award winners that were chosen by the Alumni Working Group Committee during the April 12, 2022 meeting. **Motion to accept the proposed 2022 Alumni Award winners as presented Mr. Ross; Second, Rev. Williams. Motion carried unanimously.**

Review FY2021 NWFSC/Foundation MOU:

Mr. Wampler presented the NWFSC/Foundation MOU. He highlighted specific areas of the MOU to be stricken regarding Emerald Coast Music Alliance pending dissolution of the ECMA restricted fund agreement. Mr. Stowers also noted the MOU will be updated once the 2022-2023 budget is finalized. Motion to approve the Northwest Florida State College and NWFSC Foundation MOU, Mr. Ochs; Second, Ms. Frakes. Motion carried unanimously.

New Endowments:

Mr. Wampler presented two new endowments to the Committee; Wolfrom Family Endowed Scholarship, and Douglas K. Arpke Memorial Scholarship. Steven and Patti Wolfrom created the Wolfrom Family Endowed Scholarship with a \$25,000 gift and pledge. This scholarship will provide scholarship support to a NWFSC student in financial need with first preference for a student pursuing a career in marketing or communications. In honor of his mother, Eileen Arpke, Douglas K. Arpke left a portion of his estate to NWFSC to create the Douglas K. Arpke Memorial Scholarship in honor of her love and passion for the College. This scholarship will provide financial assistance to a student pursuing an aviation career. Motion to approve the Wolfrom Family and Douglas Arpke Endowed Scholarships as presented, Mr. Rhodes; Second, Mr. Wood. Motion carried unanimously.

Development Committee Report:

Dr. Arnold provided a brief Development Committee update. NWF State College Foundation's Continuous Improvement Plan goal is to increase annual support (gifts, memberships, new pledges, and in-kind donations) to the Foundation, by 5% based on a rolling three year average, resulting in a minimum of \$1,409,349 raised by June 30, 2022. As of March 31, 2022 \$980,933 has been raised. As of April 26, 2022 76% of all Foundation Board and Trustees have given a gift or pledge payment. For FY22, there are 61 President Circle members with gift/pledge payments totaling \$30,421.

Executive Director's Report:

Mr. Stowers presented a listing of contributions over \$1,000 for January 26, 2022 – April 26, 2022. He also advised the Board that the Annual Commitment, Conflict of Interest, and Committee Selection forms for FY23 were in the packet and requested they be completed as soon as possible. Mr. Stowers also reviewed upcoming events and activities for the College.

Call to Order:

Mr. Wampler called the meeting to order at 9:01 a.m.

Foundation Bylaws/Policy Updates

Mr. Wampler presented the bylaws and policies identified by staff as needing discussion along with recommendations. Bylaws – language regarding the Treasurer providing a written report of the finances of the Foundation has not been updated to reflect quarterly Board meetings. Investment – Staff recommends the language regarding the Foundation serving as a trustee be stricken to be consistent with the GP # 16 – Gift Acceptance. Contracting and Professional Services – Staff recommends the language of the Foundation Executive Director be updated to reflect the accurate title. Restricted Funds – Staff recommends changing the language to accurately reflect the type of scholarship fund described in the policy. Naming – Staff recommends changing the language to reflect that no goods or services are being exchanged for payment, but a philanthropic gift will be recognized. Gift Acceptance – Staff

recommends updating the language to create consistency and specify that the Gift Acceptance Committee has the authority to make decisions about accepting certain gifts. **Motion to approve the changes to Bylaws, Investment, Contracting and Professional Services, Restricted Funds, Naming, and Gift Acceptance policies as presented, Mr. Woods; Second, Ms. Frakes. Motion carried unanimously.**

2022-2023 Slate of Officers and Directors:

Mr. Wampler presented the slate of officers and directors for 2022-2023. Four directors have been reappointed and two new directors will be joining our Board. Jonathan Ochs has been nominated as Treasurer. Dr. Arnold's term has been extended by one year due to his upcoming leadership role as Chair. All are excited, willing, and able to serve. **Motion to approve the 2022-23 Slate of Officers and Directors as presented, Ms. Frakes; Second, Mr. Ross. Motion carried unanimously.**

Adoption of 2022-23 Foundation Meeting Schedule:

Mr. Wampler presented the 2022-23 NWFSC Foundation Board meeting schedule. **Motion to approve** the 2022-23 NWFSC Foundation meeting schedule as presented, Mr. Ross; Second, Mr. Ochs. Motion carried unanimously.

Annual Report of the Foundation:

Mr. Wampler provided a brief annual Foundation report. He stated this has been a challenging year, but staff and Directors have worked diligently to ensure the Foundation had a successful year.

Trustee Liaison Report:

Trustee Liaison Maj Gen Litke provided his report to the Board. He stated in February 2022 the Trustees approved the issuance of an invitation to negotiate on-campus housing and the evaluation committee approved the RFP for a flight training provider, approved the ITB for the public safety garage, and approved the amendment to the 2018 Johnson Controls contract to obtain up-to-date and energy efficient lighting for both the ball fields. In March 2022 the Trustees approved the resignation of Anthony Boyer and appointed Sandy Arteaga as Interim Dean/ College Pathways/Principal of Collegiate High School. In April 2022 the Trustees approved the Okaloosa County Emergency Communications Tower agreement, selected a location for on-campus housing, and approved closing the dental program.

College Report:

Dr. Stephenson provided a college report to the Board. He stated this has been a great year legislative wise. The College has secured \$7.5M in deferred maintenance funds and \$11M to renovate our nursing building. The College is also receiving an award from Triumph Gulf Coast at the May Trustee meeting for outstanding work. Dr. Stephenson also stated the A.C.E is expanding to include dual enrollment initiatives for Okaloosa, Walton, and Holmes County. He also stated internal budget meetings for the College went great and the budget is balanced for the upcoming fiscal year.

Other Business:

Next meeting will be August 2, 2022 at 8:00 a.m. in the Morell Room 302 of Student Services.

SUBJECT: Finance and Investment Reports

Below is a summary of the Statement of Financial Position, Statement of Activities, Investment Report, and Operating Budget Review as of June 30, 2022.

Statement of Financial Position

- Total Assets are \$57,496,599 and Total Liabilities are \$145,227, bringing the Total Fund Balance to \$57,351,373.
- For the previous fiscal year as of June 30, 2021, the Total Fund Balance was \$65,443,683.

Statement of Activities

- Total Revenues were (\$2,161,268) and Total Expenses were \$5,927,871 for a Net Decrease in Fund balance of (\$8,089,138).
- A Statement of Activities from the previous fiscal year from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021 shows Total Revenues of \$16,665,959 and Total Expenses of \$3,786,120 for a Net Increase in Fund balance of \$12,879,839.

Investment Report

- The Net Decrease to the Merrill Lynch EMA account since July 1, 2021 was (\$6,667,291) bringing the Total Market Value to \$56,355,827 at June 30, 2022.
- The Net Decrease to the Vanguard Wellington Account (Science Development Fund and First Responders Fund) since July 1, 2021 was (\$27,976), bringing the Total Market Value to \$415,541 as of the last statement date of June 30, 2022.
- Combined total holdings of the Merrill Lynch EMA and Vanguard Wellington accounts were \$56,771,368. The portfolio allocation was 4.18% Cash & Cash Equivalents, 60.04% Equity, 9.75% Alternative Investments and 26.03% Fixed Income.

Operating Budget Review

• As of June 30, 2022 Total Operating Expenditures were \$329,807, leaving 29% of the budget available at the end of the fiscal year.

SUBJECT: Ramba Consulting Group, LLC Contract

The College is prohibited from using state funds to contract for lobbying services. As a result, the Foundation has engaged Ramba Consulting Group, LLC since 2017 to provide these services to the College. Ramba Consulting was instrumental in securing a \$2 million appropriation for the Health Sciences building, a \$600,000 recurring appropriation for the Vet Success Center and assisting with many other advocacy efforts.

Attached is a contract with the Ramba Consulting Group for legislative services spanning December 1, 2021 through November 30, 2022 in the amount of \$65,000. This fee is consistent with the amount budgeted for FY2022.

As excerpted from Foundation policy for Contracting and Professional Services (GP #12):

The Foundation Executive Director is the authorized individual to sign all contracts related to Foundation operations. Any contract over \$20,000 will require Board approval prior to implementation.

RECOMMENDATION:

The NWFSC Foundation Board approves the contract totaling \$65,000 with Ramba Consulting Group, LLC for the period spanning December 1, 2022 through November 30, 2023.

The scope of the representation will be to assist Northwest Florida State College Foundation in Legislative and Executive Branch lobbying. The scope of representation shall include proactive and defensive lobbying efforts, including setting up meetings with key decision makers and reporting the status of all issues.

Our governmental affairs consulting services will be performed for an annual fee of \$65,000.00, plus out-of-pocket expenses, beginning December 1, 2022, and ending November 30, 2023, to be paid in monthly installments of \$5,416.66 This agreement does not include any legal representation, only State governmental consulting services.

Northwest Florida State College Foundation acknowledges that the Firm has other clients in addition to Northwest Florida State College Foundation. However, the services provided by the Firm to other clients shall not conflict with the interests of Northwest Florida State College Foundation. In the event of a potential issue or client conflict, the Firm agrees to inform Northwest Florida State College Foundation of such issue or client conflict so that the two parties can mutually determine whether or not such conflict can and will be waived.

The Firm will, at the Firm's expense, comply with any and all applicable federal, state, or local laws, rules and regulations in performing services under this agreement, including without limitation, laws, rules and regulations governing lobbying, prohibiting lobbying limitations, Chapter 2005-359, Laws of Florida, and any rules promulgated thereunder. A copy of any

lobbyist registration shall be filed with the state prior to any lobbying taking place, and client agrees to assist in properly executing such required filings.

Review of 2022 Fundraising Goal

NWF State College Foundation's *Continuous Improvement Plan* goal is to increase annual support to the Foundation (gifts, memberships, new pledges, and in-kind donations), by 5% based on a rolling three-year average, resulting in a minimum of \$1,363,760 raised by June 30, 2023. The chart below shows total amount raised for the prior three years.

The Fiscal Year 2022 goal was \$1,409,349. With \$1,345,356 received, the Foundation achieved 96.3% of the goal.

First Generation Matching Grant

The First Generation Matching Grant (FGMG) is a need-based program providing financial aid to Florida undergraduate residents who demonstrate financial need and whose parents have not earned a baccalaureate degree.

The State of Florida has earmarked an allocation of \$22,954 to support Northwest Florida State College first generation students. The state-to-private match is 2:1 which could potentially provide \$33,759 in scholarship funds for NWFSC first-generation in college students. The amount required to receive the full allocation is \$11,477.

In 2021-2022 five Board members contributed to the First Generation Matching Grant initiative.

Certification of private contributions for FGMG is due on or before December 1, 2022.

PURPOSE OF POLICY

To establish expectations regarding a conflict of interest.

Local Language

The Northwest Florida State College Foundation conflict of interest policy shall comply with Florida Statute Chapter 112, Part III which defines a "Conflict' or 'conflict of interest' as a situation in which regard for a private interest tends to lead to disregard of a public duty or interest" (section 112.312). Further, provisions related to voting conflicts shall note that no "local public officer shall vote in an official capacity upon any measure which would inure to his or her special private gain or loss; which he or she knows would inure to the special private gain or loss of any principal by whom he or she is retained or to the parent organization or subsidiary of a corporate principal by which he or she is retained, other than an agency as defined in s. 112.312(2); or which he or she knows would inure to the special private gain or loss of a relative or business associate of the public officer. Such public officer shall, prior to the vote being taken, publicly state to the assembly the nature of the officer's interest in the matter from which he or she is abstaining from voting and, within 15 days after the vote occurs, disclose the nature of his or her interest as a public record in a memorandum filed with the person responsible for recording the minutes of the meeting, who shall incorporate the memorandum in the minutes" (section 112.3143). Form 8B, memorandum of voting conflict for local public officers shall be used to record a voting conflict. This form can be accessed at:

Total Assets are \$57,496,599 and Total Liabilities are \$145,227, bringing the Total Fund Balance to \$57,351,373. For the previous fiscal year as of June 30, 2021, the Total Fund Balance was \$65,443,683. Total Revenues were (\$2,161,268) and Total Expenses were \$5,927,871 for a Net Decrease in Fund balance of (\$8,089,138). A Statement of Activities from the previous fiscal year from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021 shows Total Revenues of \$16,665,959 and Total Expenses of \$3,786,120 for a Net Increase in Fund balance of \$12,879,839. The Net Decrease to the Merrill Lynch EMA account since July 1, 2021 was (\$6,667,291) bringing the Total Market Value to \$56,355,827 at June 30, 2022. The Net Decrease to the Vanguard Wellington Account (Science Development Fund and First Responders Fund) since July 1, 2021 was (\$27,976), bringing the Total Market Value to \$415,541 as of the last statement date of June 30, 2022. Combined total holdings of the Merrill Lynch EMA and Vanguard Wellington accounts were \$56,771,368. The portfolio allocation was 4.18% Cash & Cash Equivalents, 60.04% Equity, 9.75% Alternative Investments and 26.03% Fixed Income. As of June 30, 2022 Total Operating Expenditures were \$329,807, leaving 29% of the budget available at the end of the fiscal year. The NWFSC Foundation Finance Committee accepts the June 30, 2022 financial reports for presentation to the Board. Motion to accept and present 6/30/2022 Financial Statements to the Board, Mr. Peacock; Second, Mr. Cobb. Motion carried unanimously.

Investment Report by McGovern, O'Dell & Associates/Merrill Lynch:

Mr. McGovern presented a portfolio review as of June 30, 2022 and provided an overview of current market conditions. He presented the custom benchmark report from Blackrock, which reflected a market value of \$47,769,997 as of June 30, 2022, reminding the committee that the Blackrock report is not a representation of the Foundation's entire investment portfolio with Merrill Lynch. The Merrill Lynch report shows investment allocations stand at 61.92% equity, 24.01% fixed income, 4.24% cash and 9.83% alternative investments at June 30, 2022.

Checks Over \$5,000:

Mr. Stowers presented a listing of checks over \$5,000 from March 31,2022 through June 30, 2022. Motion to approve the checks over \$5,000 as presented, Mr. Wood; Second, Mr. Rhodes. Motion carried unanimously.

Ramba Consulting Group, LLC:

Mr. Stowers presented the Ramba Consulting Contract for December 1, 2022 through November 30, 2023 for \$65,000. Ramba Consulting is vital to obtaining the necessary funding to expand the College and its mission. Motion to approve the contract totaling \$65,000 with Ramba Consulting Group, LLC for the period spanning December 1, 2022 through November 30, 2023 for presentation to the Board, Mr. Peacock; Second, Maj Gen Litke. Motion carried unanimously.

First Generation Matching Grant (FGMG) Funds:

The State of Florida has earmarked an allocation of \$22,954 to support Northwest Florida State College first generation students. The state-to-private match is 2:1 which could potentially provide \$34,431 in scholarship funds for NWFSC first-generation in college students. The amount required to receive the

full allocation is \$11,477. Certification is due on or before December 1, 2022.
